

IMMORAL ACTS FORBIDDEN

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20 Moreover ^ythou shalt not lie carnally with thy neighbour's wife, to defile thyself with her.

21 And thou shalt not let any of thy seed ^rpass through *the fire* to ^eMo-lech, neither shalt thou ^pprofane the name of thy God: I *am* the LORD.

22 ^cThou shalt not lie with mankind, as with womankind: it is abomination.

23 ^dNeither shalt thou lie with any beast to defile thyself therewith: neither shall any woman stand before a beast to lie down thereto: it is ^econfusion.

ISRAEL NOT TO BE DEFILED

24 ^fDefile not ye yourselves in any of these things: ^gfor in all these the nations are defiled which I cast out before you:

25 And ^hthe land is defiled: therefore I do ⁱvisit the iniquity thereof upon it, and the land itself ^jvomiteth out her inhabitants.

26 ^kYe shall therefore keep my statutes and my judgments, and shall not commit *any* of these abominations; *neither* any of your own nation, nor any stranger that sojourneth among you:

27 (For all these abominations have the men of the land done, which *were* before you, and the land is defiled;)

28 That ^lthe land spue not you out also, when ye defile it, as it spued out the nations that *were* before you.

29 For whosoever shall commit any of these abominations, even the souls

that commit *them* shall be cut off from among their people.

30 Therefore shall ye keep mine ordinance, ^mthat ye commit not *any one* of these abominable customs, which were committed before you, and that ye ⁿdefile not yourselves therein: ^oI *am* the LORD your God.

CHAPTER 19
LAWS CONCERNING
PERSONAL CONDUCT



nd the LORD spake unto Mo-ses, saying,

2 Speak unto all the congregation of the children of Is-ra-el, and say unto them, ^pYe shall be holy: for I the LORD your God *am* holy.

3 ^qYe shall fear every man his mother, and his father, and ^rkeep my sabbaths: I *am* the LORD your God.

4 ^sTurn ye not unto idols, ^tnor make to yourselves molten gods: I *am* the LORD your God.

5 ^uAnd ^vif ye offer a sacrifice of peace offerings unto the LORD, ye shall offer it at your own will.

6 It shall be eaten the same day ye offer it, and on the morrow: and if ought remain until the third day, it shall be burnt in the fire.

7 And if it be eaten at all on the third day, it is abominable; it shall not be accepted.

8 Therefore *every one* that eateth it shall bear his iniquity, because he hath profaned the hallowed thing of the LORD: and that soul shall be cut off from among his people.

9 ^wAnd ^xwhen ye reap the harvest of your land, thou shalt not wholly reap the corners of thy field, neither shalt thou gather the gleanings of thy harvest.

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2 Gather yourselves together, and hear, ye sons of Ja-cob; and ^whearken unto Is-ra-el your father.

REUBEN

3 ^gReu-ben, thou *art* ^xmy firstborn, my might, ^yand the beginning of my strength, the excellency of dignity, and the excellency of power:

4 Unstable as water, ^zthou shalt not excel; because thou ^ewentest up to thy father's bed; then defiledst thou *it*: he went up to my couch.

SIMEON AND LEVI

5 ^bSim-e-on and Le-vi *are* ^cbrethren; ^dinstruments of cruelty *are* in their habitations.

6 O my soul, ^ecome not thou into their secret; ^funto their assembly, ^gmine honour, be not thou united: for ^hin their anger they slew a man, and in their selfwill they digged down a wall.

7 Cursed *be* their anger, for *it was* fierce; and their wrath, for *it was* cruel: ⁱI will divide them in Ja-cob, and scatter them in Is-ra-el.

JUDAH

8 ^jJu-dah, thou *art* ^khe whom thy brethren shall praise: ^lthy hand *shall be* in the neck of thine enemies; ^mthy father's children shall bow down before thee.

9 Ju-dah is ⁿa lion's whelp: from the prey, my son, thou art gone up: ^ohe stooped down, he couched as a lion, and as an old lion; who shall rouse him up?

10 ^pThe sceptre shall not depart from Ju-dah, nor ^qa lawgiver ^rfrom between his feet, ^suntil Shi-loh come; ^tand unto him *shall* the gathering of the people *be*.

11 ^uBinding his foal unto the vine, and his ass's colt unto the choice vine; he washed his garments in wine, and his clothes in the blood of grapes:

12 His ^veyes *shall be* red with wine, and his teeth white with milk.

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13 ^wZe-bu-lun shall dwell at the haven of the sea; and he *shall be* for an haven of ships; and his border *shall be* unto Zi-don.

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14 ^xIs-sa-char is a strong ass couching down between two burdens:

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16 ^zDan shall judge his people, as one of the tribes of Is-ra-el.

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21 ^{ae}Naph-ta-li is a hind let loose: he giveth goodly words.

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
