THE CREATION OF THE WORLD

1 In the ^abeginning, God created the heavens and the earth. ²The earth was ^bwithout form and void, and darkness was over the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God was hovering over the face of the waters.

³And God said, "Let there be light," and there was light. ⁴And God saw that the light was good. And God separated the light from the darkness. ⁵God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And there was evening and there was morning, the first day.

⁶And God said, ^d"Let there be an expanse¹ in the midst of the waters, and let it separate the waters from the waters." ⁷And God made² the expanse and ^eseparated the waters that were under the expanse from the waters that were ^fabove the expanse. And it was so. ⁸And God called the expanse Heaven.³ And there was evening and there was morning, the second day.

9And God said, ⁹"Let the waters under the heavens be gathered together into one place, and let the dry land appear." And it was so. ¹⁰God called the dry land Earth,⁴ and the waters that were gathered together he called Seas. And God saw that it was good.

¹¹And God said, ^h"Let the earth sprout vegetation, plants⁵ yielding seed, and fruit trees bearing fruit in which is their seed, each according to its kind, on the earth." And it was so. ¹²The earth brought forth vegetation, plants yielding seed according to their own kinds, and trees bearing fruit in which is their seed, each according to its kind. And God saw that it was good. ¹³And there was evening and there was morning, the third day.

14And God said, "Let there be lights in the expanse of the heavens to separate the day from the night. And let them be for 'signs and for 'seasons,⁶ and for days and years, ¹⁵ and let them be lights in the expanse of the heavens to give light upon the earth." And it was so. ¹⁶And God ^kmade the two great lights—the greater light to rule the day and the lesser light to rule the night—and the stars. ¹⁷And God set them in the expanse of the heavens to give light on the earth, ¹⁸to 'rule over the day and over the night, and to separate the light from the darkness. And God saw that it was good. ¹⁹And there was evening and there was morning, the fourth day.

²⁰And God said, "Let the waters swarm with swarms of living creatures, and let birds⁷ fly above the earth across the expanse of the heavens." ²¹So "God created the great sea creatures and every living creature that moves, with which the waters swarm, according to their kinds, and every winged bird according to its kind.

²⁸And God blessed them. And God said to them, ^s"Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth and subdue it, and have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the heavens and over every living thing that moves on the earth." ²⁹And God said, "Behold, I have given you every plant yielding seed that is on the face of all the earth, and every tree with

And it was so. **31**°And God saw everything that he had made, and behold, it was very good. And there was evening and there was morning, the sixth day.

THE SEVENTH DAY, GOD RESTS

2 Thus the heavens and the earth were finished, and "all the host of them. ²And ^xon the seventh day God finished his work that he had done, and he rested on the seventh day from all his work that he had done. ³So God blessed the seventh day and made it holy, because on it God rested from all his work that he had done in creation.

THE CREATION OF MAN AND WOMAN

hear when I speak with you, and may also ^dbelieve you forever."

When Moses told the words of the people to the LORD, ¹⁰ the LORD said to Moses, "Go to the people and ^econsecrate them today and tomorrow, and let them ^fwash their garments ¹¹and be ready for the third day. For on the third day ⁹the LORD will come down on Mount Sinai in the sight of all the people. 12 And you shall set limits for the people all around, saying, 'Take care not to go up into the mountain or touch the edge of it. hWhoever touches the mountain shall be put to death. ¹³No hand shall touch him, but he shall be stoned or shot;1 whether beast or man, he shall not live.' When ⁱthe trumpet sounds a long blast, they shall come up to the mountain." ¹⁴So Moses ^jwent down from the mountain to the people and ^econsecrated the people; ^fand they washed their garments. ¹⁵And he said to the people, "Be ready for the ^kthird day; ^ldo not go near a woman."

¹⁶On the morning of the ^kthird day there were ^mthunders and lightnings and ⁿa thick cloud on the mountain and a very loud ^otrumpet blast, so that all the people in the camp ^ptrembled. ¹⁷Then ^qMoses brought the people out of the camp to meet God, and they took their stand at the foot of the mountain. ¹⁸Now 'Mount Sinai was wrapped in smoke because the LORD had descended on it in fire. The smoke of it went up like the smoke of a kiln, and ^sthe whole mountain trembled greatly. ¹⁹And as the ^osound of the trumpet grew louder and louder, Moses spoke,

⁸ⁱ"Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. ⁹/Six days you shall labor, and do all your work, ¹⁰but the ^kseventh day is a Sabbath to the LORD your God. On it you shall not do any work, you, or your son, or your daughter, your male servant, or your female servant, or your livestock, or the 'sojourner who is within your gates. ¹¹For ^min six days the LORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, and rested on the seventh day. give Urim. But if this guilt is in your people Israel, give Thummim."¹ "And Jonathan and Saul were taken, but the people escaped. 4²Then Saul said, ""Cast the lot between me and my son Jonathan." And Jonathan was taken.

43Then Saul said to Jonathan, °"Tell me what you have done." And Jonathan told him, "I tasted a little honey with the tip of the staff that was in my hand. Here I am; I will die." 44And Saul said, ^q"God do so to me and more also; 'vou shall surely die, Jonathan." 45Then the people said to Saul, "Shall Jonathan die, who has worked this great salvation in Israel? Far from it! As the LORD lives, sthere shall not one hair of his head fall to the ground, for he has worked with God this day." So the people ransomed Jonathan, so that he did not die. 46 Then Saul went up from pursuing the Philistines, and the Philistines went to their own place.

SAUL FIGHTS ISRAEL'S ENEMIES

⁴⁷When Saul had taken the kingship over Israel, he fought against all his enemies on every side, against Moab, ^tagainst the Ammonites, against Edom, against the kings of "Zobah, and against the Philistines. Wherever he turned he routed them. ⁴⁸And he did valiantly ^{*}and struck the Amalekites and delivered Israel out of the hands of those who plundered them.

49"Now the sons of Saul were Jonathan, Ishvi, and Malchi-shua. And the names of his two daughters were these: the name of the firstborn was "Merab, and the name of the younger Michal. ⁵⁰And the name of Saul's wife was Ahinoam the daughter of Ahimaaz. 'And the name of the commander of his army was Abner the son of Ner, ²Saul's uncle. ^{5I}^aKish was the father of Saul, and Ner the father of Abner was the son of ^aAbiel.

5²There was hard fighting against the Philistines all the days of Saul. And when Saul saw any strong man, or any valiant man, ^bhe attached him to himself.

THE LORD REJECTS SAUL

15 And Samuel said to Saul, "The LORD sent me to anoint you king over his people Israel; now therefore listen to the words of the LORD. ²Thus says the LORD of hosts, 'I have noted what Amalek did to Israel ^din opposing them on the way when they came up out of Egypt. ³Now go and strike Amalek and ^edevote to destruction² all that they have. Do not spare them, ^fbut kill both man and woman, child and infant, ox and sheep, camel and donkey."

4So Saul summoned the people and numbered them in Telaim, two hundred thousand men on foot, and ten thousand men of Judah. 5And Saul came to the city of Amalek and lay in wait in the valley. ⁶Then Saul said to ⁹the Kenites, "Go, depart; go down from among the Amalekites, lest I destroy you with them. ^hFor you showed kindness to all the people of Israel when they came up out of Egypt." So the Kenites departed from among the Amalekites. 7ⁱAnd Saul defeated the Amalekites from ^{*j*}Havilah as far as ^kShur, which is east of Egypt. ⁸And he took Agag the king of the Amalekites alive 'and devoted to destruction all the people with the edge of the sword.

¹⁰The word of the LORD came to Samuel: IIⁿ"I regret² that I have made Saul king, for he has turned back from following me and °has not performed my commandments." And Samuel was angry, and he cried to the LORD all night. 12 And Samuel rose early to meet Saul in the morning. And it was told Samuel, "Saul came to ^{*p*}Carmel, and behold, he set up a monument for himself and turned and passed on and went down to Gilgal." ¹³And Samuel came to Saul, and Saul said to him, "Blessed be you to the LORD. ¹⁵^{*j*} Beware of false prophets, who come to you in sheep's clothing but inwardly are kravenous wolves. 16 You will recognize them 'by their fruits. Are grapes gathered from thornbushes, or figs from thistles? ¹⁷So, ^mevery healthy tree bears good fruit, but the diseased tree bears bad fruit. ¹⁸A healthy tree cannot bear bad fruit, nor can a diseased tree bear good fruit. ¹⁹ⁿEvery tree that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire. ²⁰Thus you will recognize them 'by their fruits.

the grace of God and the free gift by the grace of that one man Jesus Christ abounded for ^bmany. ¹⁶And the free gift is not like the result of that one man's sin. For ^cthe judgment following one trespass brought condemnation, but the free gift following many trespasses brought ^djustification. ¹⁷For if, because of one man's trespass, death reigned through that one man, much more will those who receive the abundance of grace and the free gift of righteousness ^ereign in life through the one man Jesus Christ.

¹⁸Therefore, as one trespass' led to condemnation for all men, so one act of righteousness² leads to justification and life for ^fall men. ¹⁹For as by the one man's ^gdisobedience the many were made sinners, so by the one man's ^hobedience the many will be made righteous. ²⁰Now ⁱthe law came in to increase the trespass, but where sin increased, ^jgrace abounded all the more, ²¹so that, ^kas sin reigned in death, ^jgrace also might reign through righteousness leading to eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.

DEAD TO SIN, ALIVE TO GOD

6 What shall we say then? "Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound? ²By no means! How can "we who died to sin still live in it? ³Do you not know that all of us ^owho have been baptized ^pinto Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? ⁴We were ^gburied therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as 'Christ was raised from the dead by ^sthe glory of the Father, we too might walk in 'newness of life.

⁵For "if we have been united with him in ^va death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. ⁶We know that "our old self³ *was crucified with him in order that ^ythe body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. 7For ^zone who has died ^ahas been set free⁴ from sin. ⁸Now ^{*b*} if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. 9We know that 'Christ. being raised from the dead, will never die again; ^ddeath no longer has dominion over him. ¹⁰For the death he died he died to sin, once for all, but the life he lives he lives to God. ^{II}So you also must consider yourselves ^fdead to sin and alive to God in Christ lesus.

¹²Let not ^{*g*}sin therefore reign in your mortal body, to make you obey its passions. ¹³^{*h*}Do not present your members to sin as instruments for unrighteousness, but ^{*i*}present yourselves to God as those who have been brought from death to life, and your members to God as instruments for righteousness. ¹⁴For^{*i*}sin ^{*k*}will have no dominion over you, since you are not under law but under grace.

SLAVES TO RIGHTEOUSNESS

¹⁵What then? 'Are we to sin "because we are not under law but under grace? By no means! ¹⁶Do you not know that if you present yourselves "to anyone as obedient slaves,⁵ you are slaves

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of the one whom you obey, either of sin, which leads to death, or of obedience, which leads to righteousness? ¹⁷But °thanks be to God, that you who were once slaves of sin have become obedient from the heart to the ^pstandard of teaching to which you were committed, 18 and, 4 having been set free from sin, 'have become slaves of righteousness. 19°I am speaking in human terms, because of your natural limitations. For 'just as you once presented your members as slaves to impurity and to lawlessness leading to more lawlessness, so now present vour members "as slaves to righteousness leading to sanctification.

²⁰ For when you were slaves of sin, you were free in regard to righteousness. ²¹ "But what fruit were you getting at that time from the things ^xof which you are now ashamed? "For the end of those things is death. ²²But now that you ^zhave been set free from sin and ^ahave become slaves of God, ^bthe fruit you get leads to sanctification and ^cits end, eternal life. ²³ For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

RELEASED FROM THE LAW

7 Or do you not know, brothers' for I am speaking to those who know the law—that the law is binding on a person only as long as he lives? ²For ^ea married woman is bound by law to her husband while he lives, but if her husband dies she is released from the law of marriage.² 3Accordingly, ^fshe will be called an adulteress

if she lives with another man while her husband is alive. But if her husband dies, she is free from that law, and if she marries another man she is not an adulteress.

⁴Likewise, my brothers, ^gyou also have died ^hto the law ⁱthrough the body of Christ, so that you may belong to another, to him who has been raised from the dead, ^jin order that we may bear fruit for God. ⁵For while we were living in the flesh, our sinful passions, aroused by the law, were at work ^kin our members 'to bear fruit for death. ⁶But now we are released from the law, having died to that which held us captive, so that we serve in the ^mnew way of ⁿthe Spirit and not in the old way of the written code.³

THE LAW AND SIN

7What then shall we say? That the law is sin? By no means! Yet if it had not been for the law, °I would not have known sin. For I would not have known what it is to covet if ^{*p*} the law had not said, "You shall not covet." ⁸But sin, ⁹seizing an opportunity through the commandment, produced in me all kinds of covetousness. 'For apart from the law, sin lies dead. 9I was once alive apart from the law, but when the commandment came, sin came alive and I died. ¹⁰The very commandment sthat promised life proved to be death to me. ¹¹For sin, 'seizing an opportunity through the commandment, "deceived me and through it killed me. ¹²So ^vthe law is holy, and the commandment is holy and righteous and good.

¹³Did that which is good, then, bring death to me? By no means! It was

sin, producing death in me through what is good, in order that sin might be shown to be sin, and through the commandment might become sinful beyond measure. ¹⁴For we know that the law is spiritual, but I am of the flesh, "sold under sin. 15For I do not understand my own actions. For ^xI do not do what I want. but I do the very thing I hate. ¹⁶Now if I do what I do not want, I agree with ^ythe law, that it is good. ¹⁷So now ^zit is no longer I who do it, but sin that dwells within me. ¹⁸For I know that nothing good dwells ^ain me, that is, in my flesh. For I have the desire to do what is right, but not the ability to carry it out. 19^bFor I do not do the good I want, but the evil I do not want is what I keep on doing. 20 Now if I do what I do not want, 'it is no longer I who do it, but sin that dwells within me.

²¹So I find it to be a law that when I want to do right, evil lies close at hand. ²²For ⁴I delight in the law of God, ^ein my inner being, ²³but I see in my members ^fanother law waging war against the law of my mind and making me captive to the law of sin that dwells in my members. ²⁴Wretched man that I am! Who will deliver me from ^gthis body of death? ²⁵Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord! So then, I myself serve the law of God with my mind, but with my flesh I serve the law of sin.

LIFE IN THE SPIRIT

8 There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus.¹ ²For the law of ^hthe Spirit of life 'has set you² free in Christ Jesus from the law of sin and death. ³For 'God has done what the law, ^kweakened by the flesh, ^lcould not do. "By sending his own Son "in the likeness of sinful flesh and °for sin,³ he condemned sin in the flesh, 4in order that ^{*p*} the righteous requirement of the law might be fulfilled in us, ^{*q*}who walk not according to the flesh but according to the Spirit. 5For 'those who live according to the flesh set their minds on ^sthe things of the flesh, but those who live according to the Spirit set their minds on ^tthe things of the Spirit. ⁶For to set "the mind on the flesh is death, but to set the mind on the Spirit is life and peace. 7For the mind that is set on the flesh is ^vhostile to God, for it does not submit to God's law: "indeed, it cannot. ⁸Those who are in the flesh cannot please God.

9You, however, are not in the flesh but in the Spirit, if in fact^xthe Spirit of God dwells in you. ^yAnyone who does not have ^zthe Spirit of Christ does not belong to him. ^{IO}But if Christ is in you, although the body is dead because of sin, the Spirit is life because of righteousness. ^{II}If the Spirit of ^ahim who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, he who raised Christ Jesus⁴ from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies ^bthrough his Spirit who dwells in you.

¹²So then, brothers,⁵ we are debtors, ^cnot to the flesh, to live according to the flesh. ¹³For if you live according to the flesh you will die, but if by the Spirit you ^dput to death the deeds of

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the body, you will live. ¹⁴For all who are ^eled by the Spirit of God are ^fsons¹ of God. ¹⁵For ^gyou did not receive ^hthe spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received the Spirit of ^fadoption as sons, by whom we cry, ^j"Abba! Father!" ¹⁶ ^kThe Spirit himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, ¹⁷and if children, then ^fheirs—heirs of God and fellow heirs with Christ, ^mprovided we suffer with him in order that we may also be glorified with him.

FUTURE GLORY

¹⁸For I consider that the sufferings of this present time "are not worth comparing with the glory that is to be revealed to us. ¹⁹For the creation waits with eager longing for °the revealing of the sons of God. ²⁰For the creation ^{*p*}was subjected to futility, not willingly, but ⁹because of him who subjected it, in hope ²¹that 'the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to corruption and obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God. ²²For we know that ^sthe whole creation thas been groaning together in the pains of childbirth until now. ²³And not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have "the firstfruits of the Spirit, ^vgroan inwardly as ^wwe wait eagerly for adoption as sons, "the redemption of our bodies. ²⁴For^yin this hope we were saved. Now ^zhope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes

Christ Jesus is the one who died—more than that, who was raised—"who is at the right hand of God, 'who indeed is interceding for us.⁵ ³⁵Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or

""For your sake 'we are being killed all the day long; we are regarded as sheep to be slaughtered."

³⁷No, in all these things we are more than ^yconquerors through ^zhim who loved us. ³⁸For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, ³⁹nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

GOD'S SOVEREIGN CHOICE

^aI am speaking the truth in Christ-I am not lying; my conscience bears me witness in the Holv Spirit—²that I have great sorrow and unceasing anguish in my heart. 3For ^bI could wish that I myself were ^caccursed and cut off from Christ for the sake of my brothers,¹ my kinsmen ^daccording to the flesh. 4They are 'Israelites, and to them belong^{*t*} the adoption, ^gthe glory, ^hthe covenants, ⁱthe giving of the law, ^{*j*}the worship, and ^{*k*}the promises. 5To them belong 'the patriarchs, and from their race, according to the flesh, is the Christ, "who is God over all, "blessed forever. Amen.

⁶But it is not as though the word of God has failed. For not all who are descended from Israel belong to Israel, 7 and not all are children of Abraham °because they are his offspring, but ^p"Through Isaac shall your offspring be named." ⁸This means that it is not the children of the flesh who are the children of God, but ^qthe children of the promise are counted as offspring. 9For this is what the promise said: "About this time next year I will return, and Sarah shall have a son." ¹⁰And not only so, but ^salso when Rebekah had conceived children by one man, our forefather Isaac, ¹¹though they were not yet born and had done nothing either good or bad—in order that God's purpose of election might continue, not because of works but because of thim who calls— 12she was told, ""The older will serve the younger." ¹³As it is written, ^v"Jacob I loved. but Esau I hated."

¹⁴What shall we say then? "Is there injustice on God's part? By no means! ¹⁵For he says to Moses, ^x"I will have mercy on whom I have mercy, and I will have compassion on whom I have compassion." ¹⁶So then it depends not on human will or exertion,² but on God, who has mercy. ¹⁷For the Scripture says to Pharaoh, ^y"For this very purpose I have raised you up, that I might show my power in you, and that my name might be proclaimed in all the earth." ¹⁸So then he has mercy on whomever he wills, and he hardens whomever he wills.

¹⁹You will say to me then, "Why does he still find fault?
