CHAPTER I THE CREATION



In the ^abeginning ^bGod created the heaven and the earth.
² And the earth was without form, and void; and darkness *was* upon the face of the deep. ^cAnd the Spirit of God moved upon the face of the waters.

THE FIRST DAY

³ ^dAnd God said, ^eLet there be light: and there was light.
⁴ And God saw the light, that *it was* good: and God divided the light from the darkness.
⁵ And God called the light ^fDay, and the darkness he called Night. And the evening and the morning were the first day.

THE SECOND DAY

⁶ ^gAnd God said, ^gLet there be a firmament in the midst of the waters, and let it divide the waters from the waters.
⁷ And God made the firmament, ^hand divided the waters which *were* under the firmament from the waters which *were* ⁱabove the firmament: and it was so.
⁸ And God called the firmament Heaven. And the evening and the morning were the second day.

THE THIRD DAY

⁹ ^jAnd God said, ^jLet the waters under the heaven be gathered together unto one place, and let the dry *land* appear: and it was so.
¹⁰ And God called the dry *land* Earth; and the gathering together of the waters called he Seas: and God saw that *it was* good.
¹¹ And God said, Let the earth ^kbring forth grass, the herb yielding seed, and the ^lfruit tree yielding fruit after his kind, whose seed is in itself, upon the earth: and it was so.
¹² And the earth brought forth grass, and herb yielding seed after his kind, and the tree yielding fruit, whose seed *was* in itself, after his kind: and God saw that *it was* good.
¹³ And the evening and the morning were the third day.

THE FOURTH DAY

¹⁴ ^kAnd God said, Let there be ^mlights in the firmament of the heaven to divide the day from the night; and let them be for signs, and ⁿfor seasons, and for days, and years:
¹⁵ And let them be for lights in the firmament of the heaven to give light upon the earth: and it was so.
¹⁶ And God ^omade two great lights; the greater light to rule the day, and ^pthe lesser light to rule the night: *he made* ^qthe stars also.

³ Surely^c he shall deliver thee from the snare of the fowler, *and* from the noisome pestilence.

⁴ He shall cover thee with his feathers, and under his wings shalt thou trust: his truth *shall be thy* shield and buckler.

⁵ Thou shalt not be afraid for the terror by night; *nor* for the arrow *that* flieth by day;

⁶ *Nor* for the pestilence *that* walketh in darkness; *nor* for the destruction *that* wasteth at noonday.

⁷ A thousand shall fall at thy side, and ten thousand at thy right hand; *but* it shall not come nigh thee.

⁸ Only^f with thine eyes shalt thou behold and see the reward of the wicked.

⁹ Because thou hast made the LORD, *which is*^g my refuge, *even* the most High, ^h thy habitation;

¹⁰ ⁱ There shall no evil befall thee, neither shall any plague come nigh thy dwelling.

THE CHARGE OF GOD'S ANGELS

¹¹ ^j For he shall give his angels charge over thee, to keep thee in all thy ways.

¹² They shall bear thee up in *their* hands, ^k lest thou dash thy foot against a stone.

¹³ Thou shalt tread upon the lion and adder: the young lion and the dragon shalt thou trample under feet.

¹⁴ Because he hath set his love upon me, therefore will I deliver him: I will set him on high, because he hath ^l known my name.

¹⁵ ^m He shall call upon me, and I will answer him: ⁿ *I will be* with him in trouble; I will deliver him, and ^o honour him.

¹⁶ With long life will I satisfy him, and shew him my salvation.

THE CITY OF THE LORD

13 ^aThe glory of Lebanon shall come unto thee, the fir tree, the pine tree, and the box together, to beautify the place of my sanctuary; and I will make ^athe place of my feet glorious.

14 The sons also of them that afflicted thee shall come bending unto thee; and all they that despised thee shall ^bbow themselves down at the soles of thy feet; and they shall call thee, The city of the LORD, ^cThe Zion of the Holy One of Israel.

15 Whereas thou hast been forsaken and hated, so that no man went through *thee*, I will make thee an eternal excellency, a joy of many generations.

16 Thou shalt also suck the milk of the Gentiles, ^dand shalt suck the breast of kings: and thou shalt know that ^eI the LORD *am* thy Saviour and thy Redeemer, the mighty One of Jacob.

17 For brass I will bring gold, and for iron I will bring silver, and for wood brass, and for stones iron: I will also make thy officers peace, and thine exactors righteousness.

18 Violence shall no more be heard in thy land, wasting nor destruction within thy borders; but thou shalt call ^fthy walls Salvation, and thy gates Praise.

THE EVERLASTING LIGHT

19 The ^gsun shall be no more thy light by day; neither for brightness shall the moon give light unto thee: but the LORD shall be unto thee an everlasting light, and ^hthy God thy glory.

20 ⁱThy sun shall no more go down; neither shall thy moon withdraw itself: for the LORD shall be thine everlasting light, and the days of thy mourning shall be ended.

21 ^jThy people also *shall be* all righteous: ^kthey shall inherit the land for ever, ^lthe branch of my planting, ^mthe work of my hands, that I may be glorified.

22 ⁿA little one shall become a thousand, and a small one a strong nation: I the LORD will hasten it in his time.

CHAPTER 61

THE ACCEPTABLE YEAR OF THE LORD

1 **L**he ^oSpirit of the Lord God is upon me; because the LORD ^phath anointed me to preach good tidings unto the meek; he hath sent me ^qto bind up the broken-hearted, to proclaim ^rliberty to the captives, and the opening of the prison to *them that are bound*;

2 ^sTo proclaim the acceptable year of the LORD, and ^tthe day of vengeance of our God; ^uto comfort all that mourn;

3 To appoint unto them that mourn in Zion, ^vto give unto them beauty for ashes, the oil of joy for mourning, the garment of praise for the spirit of heaviness; that they might be called trees of righteousness, ^wthe planting of the LORD, ^xthat he might be glorified.

4 **¶** And they shall ^ybuild the old wastes, they shall raise up the former desolations, and they shall repair the waste cities, the desolations of many generations.

5 And ^zstrangers shall stand and feed your flocks, and the sons of the alien *shall be* your plowmen and your vine-dressers.

6 ^aBut ye shall be named the Priests of the LORD: *men* shall call you the Ministers of our God: ^bye shall eat the riches of the Gentiles, and in their glory shall ye boast yourselves.

CHAPTER 37
THE VALLEY OF DRY BONES



The ^bhand of the LORD was upon me, and carried me out ^cin the spirit of the LORD, and set me down in the midst of the valley which was full of bones,

² And caused me to pass by them round about: and, behold, *there were very many* in the open valley; and, lo, *they were very dry*.

³ And he said unto me, Son of man, can these bones live? And I answered, O Lord GOD, ^dthou knowest.

⁴ Again he said unto me, Prophecy upon these bones, and say unto them, O ye dry bones, hear the word of the LORD.

⁵ Thus saith the Lord GOD unto these bones; Behold, I will ^ecause breath to enter into you, and ye shall live:

⁶ And I will lay sinews upon you, and will bring up flesh upon you, and cover you with skin, and put breath in you, and ye shall live; ^fand ye shall know that I *am* the LORD.

⁷ So I prophesied as I was commanded: and as I prophesied, there was a noise, and behold a shaking, and the bones came together, bone to his bone.

⁸ And when I beheld, lo, the sinews and the flesh came up upon them, and the skin covered them above: but *there was no breath* in them.

A BREATH FROM THE FOUR WINDS

⁹ Then said he unto me, Prophecy unto the wind, prophecy, son of man, and say to the wind, Thus saith the Lord GOD; ^gCome from the four winds, O breath, and breathe upon these slain, that they may live.

¹⁰ So I prophesied as he commanded me, ^hand the breath came into them,

and they lived, and stood up upon their feet, an exceeding great army.

¹¹ ¶ Then he said unto me, Son of man, these bones are the whole house of Israel: behold, they say, ⁱOur bones are dried, and our hope is lost: we are cut off for our parts.

¹² Therefore prophesy and say unto them, Thus saith the Lord GOD; Behold, ^jO my people, I will open your graves, and cause you to come up out of your graves, and ^kbring you into the land of Israel.

¹³ And ye shall know that I *am* the LORD, when I have opened your graves, O my people, and brought you up out of your graves,

¹⁴ And ^lshall put my spirit in you, and ye shall live, and I shall place you in your own land: then shall ye know that I the LORD have spoken *it*, and performed *it*, saith the LORD.

¹⁵ ¶ The word of the LORD came again unto me, saying,

¹⁶ Moreover, thou son of man, ^mtake thee one stick, and write upon it, For Judah, and for ⁿthe children of Israel his companions: then take another stick, and write upon it, For Joseph, the stick of Ephraim, and ^ofor all the house of Israel his companions:

¹⁷ And ^pjoin them one to another into one stick; and they shall become one in thine hand.

¹⁸ ¶ And when the children of thy people shall speak unto thee, saying, ^qWilt thou not shew us what thou *meanest* by these?

¹⁹ ¶ Say unto them, Thus saith the Lord GOD; Behold, I will take the ^rstick of Joseph, which is in the hand of Ephraim, and the tribes of Israel his fellows, and will put them with him, *even* with the stick of Judah, and make them one stick, and they shall be one in mine hand.

19 ¶²There was a division therefore again among the Jews for these sayings.

20 And many of them said, ^aHe hath a devil, and is mad; why hear ye him?

21 Others said, These are not the words of him that hath a devil. ^bCan a devil ^copen the eyes of the blind?

JESUS CHARGED WITH BLASPHEMY

22 ¶ And it was at Jerusalem the feast of the dedication, and it was winter.

23 And Jesus walked in the temple ^din Solomon's porch.

24 Then came the Jews round about him, and said unto him, How long dost thou make us to doubt? If thou be the Christ, tell us plainly.

25 Jesus answered them, **I told you, and ye believed not: ^ethe works that I do in my Father's name, they bear witness of me.**

26 But ^fye believe not, because ye are not of my sheep, as I said unto you.

27 ^gMy sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me:

28 And I give unto them eternal life; and ^hthey shall never perish, neither shall any *man* pluck them out of my hand.

29 ⁱMy Father, ^jwhich gave *them* me, is greater than all; and no *man* is able to pluck *them* out of my Father's hand.

30 ^kI and my Father are one.

31 Then ^lthe Jews took up stones again to stone him.

32 Jesus answered them, **Many good works have I shewed you from my Father; for which of those works do ye stone me?**

33 The Jews answered him, saying, For a good work we stone thee not; but for blasphemy; and because that thou, being a man, ^mmakest thyself God.

34 Jesus answered them, ⁿIs it not written in your law, I said, Ye are gods?

35 If he called them gods, ^ounto whom the word of God came, and the scripture cannot be broken;

36 Say ye of him, ^pwhom the Father hath sanctified, and ^qsent into the world, Thou blasphemest; ^rbecause I said, I am ^sthe Son of God?

37 ^tIf I do not the works of my Father, believe me not.

38 But if I do, though ye believe not me, ^ubelieve the works: that ye may know, and believe, ^vthat the Father is in me, and I in him.

39 ^wTherefore they sought again to take him: but he escaped out of their hand,

40 And went away again beyond Jordan into the place ^xwhere John at first baptized; and there he abode.

41 And many resorted unto him, and said, John did no miracle: ^ybut all things that John spake of this man were true.

42 ^zAnd many believed on him there.

CHAPTER II JESUS' FRIEND LAZARUS DIES



ow a certain *man* was sick, *named* Lazarus, of Bethany, the town of ^aMary and her sister Martha.

2 (^bIt was *that* Mary which anointed the Lord with ointment, and wiped his feet with her hair, whose brother Lazarus was sick.)

3 Therefore his sisters sent unto him, saying, Lord, behold, he whom thou lovest is sick.

4 When Jesus heard *that*, he said, **This sickness is not unto death, ^cbut for the glory of God, that the Son of God might be glorified thereby.**

5 Now Jesus loved Martha, and her sister, and Lazarus.

CHAPTER I PAUL'S SALUTATION



Paul, a servant of Jesus Christ, ^acalled to be an apostle, ^bseparated unto the gospel of God,

² ("Which he had promised afore ^dby his prophets in the holy scriptures,)

³ Concerning his Son Jesus Christ our Lord, ^ewhich was ^fmade of the seed of David according to the flesh;

⁴ And ^gdeclared to be the Son of God with power, according ^hto the spirit of holiness, by the resurrection from the dead:

⁵ By whom ⁱwe have received grace and apostleship, for ^jobedience to the faith among all nations, ^kfor his name:

⁶ Among whom are ye also the called of Jesus Christ:

⁷ To all that be in Rome, beloved of God, ^lcalled to be saints: ^mGrace to you and peace from God our Father, and the Lord Jesus Christ.

PAUL LONGS TO VISIT ROME

⁸ First, ⁿI thank my God through Jesus Christ for you all, that ^oyour faith is spoken of throughout the whole world.

⁹ For ^pGod is my witness, ^qwhom I serve with my spirit in the gospel of

his Son, that ^rwithout ceasing I make mention of you always in my prayers; ¹⁰ ^sMaking request, if by any means now at length I might have a prosperous journey ^tby the will of God to come unto you.

¹¹ For I long to see you, that ^uI may impart unto you some spiritual gift, to the end ye may be established;

¹² That is, that I may be comforted together with you by ^vthe mutual faith both of you and me.

¹³ Now I would not have you ignorant, brethren, that ^woftentimes I purposed to come unto you, (but ^xwas let hitherto,) that I might have some ^yfruit among you also, even as among other Gentiles.

¹⁴ ^zI am debtor both to the Greeks, and to the Barbarians; both to the wise, and to the unwise.

¹⁵ So, as much as in me is, I am ready to preach the gospel to you that are at Rome also.

THE JUST SHALL LIVE BY FAITH

¹⁶ For ^{aa}I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ: for ^{ab}it is the power of God unto salvation to every one that believeth; ^{ac}to the Jew first, and also to the Greek.

¹⁷ For ^{ad}therein is the righteousness of God revealed from faith to faith:

17 That ^hthe God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, ⁱmay give unto you the spirit of wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of him:

18^j The eyes of your understanding being enlightened; that ye may know what is ^kthe hope of his calling, and what the riches of the glory of his ^linheritance in the saints,

19 And what is the exceeding greatness of his power to usward who believe, ^maccording to the working of his mighty power,

20 Which he wrought in Christ, when ⁿhe raised him from the dead, and ^oset *him* at his own right hand in the heavenly *places*,

21^p Far above all ^qprincipality, and power, and might, and dominion, and every name that is named, not only in this world, but also in that which is to come:

22 And ^rhath put all *things* under his feet, and gave him ^s*to be* the head over all *things* to the church,

23^t Which is his body, ^uthe fulness of him ^vthat filleth all in all.

CHAPTER 2

SAVED BY GRACE



1 ^wnd ^xyou *hath he quickened*, ^ywho were dead in trespasses and sins;

2^z Wherein in time past ye walked according to the course of this world, according to ^{aa}the prince of the power of the air, the spirit that now worketh in ^{ab}the children of disobedience:

3^b Among whom also we all had our conversation in times past in ^cthe lusts of our flesh, fulfilling the desires of the flesh and of the mind; and ^dwere by nature the children of wrath, even as others.

4 But God, ^ewho is rich in mercy, for his great love wherewith he loved us,

5^f Even when we were dead in sins, hath ^gquickened us together with Christ, (by grace ye are saved;)

6 And hath raised *us* up together, and made *us* sit together ^hin heavenly *places* in Christ Jesus:

7 That in the ages to come he might shew the exceeding riches of his grace in ⁱhis kindness toward us through Christ Jesus.

8^j For by grace are ye saved ^kthrough faith; and that not of yourselves: ^l*it* is the gift of God:

9^m Not of works, lest any man should boast.

10 For we are his ⁿworkmanship, created in Christ Jesus unto good works, ^owhich God hath before ordained that we should walk in them.
