THE DANGER OF FALLING AWAY

6 Therefore ^{*a*}leaving ^{*b*}the ^{*i*}elementary teaching about the ^{*2*}Christ, let us press on to ^{3,c}maturity, not laying again a foundation of repentance from ^{*d*}dead works and of faith toward God,

² of ^{*a*}instruction about ¹washings and ^{*b*}laying on of hands, and about the ^cresurrection of the dead and ^ceternal judgment.

³And this we will do, ^{*a*} if God permits.

⁴ For it is ^{*a*}impossible, in the case of those who have once been ^{*a*}enlightened and have tasted of ^{*b*}the heavenly gift and have been made ^{*c*}partakers of the Holy Spirit,

⁵ and ^{*a*}have tasted the good ^{*b*}word of God and the powers of ^{*c*}the age to come, ⁶ and *then* have 'fallen away, to ^{*a*}restore them again to repentance, ^{2,*b*}since they again crucify to themselves the Son of God and put Him to open shame. ⁷ For ground that drinks the rain which often 'falls on it and produces vegetation useful to those ^{*a*}for whose sake it is also tilled, receives a blessing from God;

⁸but if it yields thorns and thistles, it is worthless and ^{1,a}close to being cursed, and ²it ends up being burned.

BETTER THINGS FOR YOU

⁹But, ^abeloved, we are convinced of better things regarding you, and things that ¹accompany salvation, even though we are speaking in this way.

¹⁰ For ^aGod is not unjust so as to forget ^byour work and the love which you have shown toward His name, by having ^cserved and by *still* serving the ¹saints.

¹¹And we desire that each one of you demonstrate the same diligence 'so as to realize the ^afull assurance of ^bhope until the end,

¹² so that you will not be sluggish, but ^{*a*} imitators of those who through ^{*b*} faith and endurance ^{*c*} inherit the promises.

¹³For ^{*a*}when God made the promise to Abraham, since He could swear an oath by no one greater, He ^{*b*}swore by Himself,

¹⁴ saying, "^aINDEED I WILL GREATLY BLESS YOU AND I WILL GREATLY MUL-TIPLY YOU."

¹⁵And so, ^{*a*}having patiently waited, he obtained the promise.

¹⁶^aFor people swear an oath by 'one greater *than themselves*, and with them ^ban oath *serving* as confirmation is an end of every dispute.

¹⁷¹In the same way God, desiring even more to demonstrate to ^athe heirs of the promise ^{2,b}the fact that His purpose is unchangeable, ³confirmed it with an oath,

¹⁸ so that by two unchangeable things in which ^a it is impossible for God to lie, we who have taken refuge would have strong encouragement to hold firmly to ^b the hope set before us.

⁶^{*a*}and swore by ^{*b*}Him who lives forever and ever, ^{*c*}who created heaven and the things in it, and the earth and the things in it, and the sea and the things in it, that ^dthere will no longer be a delay,

⁷but in the days of the voice of the ^aseventh angel, when he is about to sound, then ^bthe mystery of God is finished, as He announced to His servants the prophets.

⁸Then ^athe voice which I heard from heaven, *I heard* again speaking with me, and saying, "Go, take ^b the scroll which is open in the hand of the angel who ^bstands on the sea and on the land."

⁹And I went to the angel, telling him to give me the little scroll. And he *said to me, "a Take it and eat it; it will make your stomach bitter, but in your mouth it will be sweet as honey."

¹⁰ I took the little scroll from the angel's hand and ate it, and in my mouth it was sweet as honey; and when I had eaten it, my stomach was made bitter.

¹¹And ^athey *said to me, "You must ^bprophesy again concerning ^cmany peoples, nations, languages, and ^dkings.²

Then there was given to me a ^{1,a} measuring rod like a staff; ² and ^b someone said, "Get up and measure the ³temple of God and the altar, and those who worship in it.

²"Leave out the ^acourtyard which is outside the ²temple and do not measure it, because ^bit has been given to the nations; and they will ^btrample ^cthe holy city for ^d forty-two months.

³"And I will grant *authority* to my two ^awitnesses, and they will prophesy for ^b1,260 days, clothed in ^csackcloth."

⁵And if anyone wants to harm them, ^afire flows out of their mouth and devours their enemies; and *so* if anyone wants to harm them, ^bhe must be killed in this way.
