21When Enoch had lived 65 years, he fathered Methuselah, ²²Enoch ^uwalked with God1 after he fathered Methuselah 300 years and had other sons and daughters. 23Thus all the days of Enoch were 365 years. 24Enoch "walked with God, and he was not, 1 v for God took him.

25 When Methuselah had lived 187 years. he fathered Lamech. 26Methuselah lived after he fathered Lamech 782 years and had other sons and daughters, 27Thus all the days of Methuselah were 969 years, and he died.

28When Lamech had lived 182 years, he fathered a son 29 and called his name Noah. saying, "Out of the ground wthat the LORD has cursed this one shall bring us relief1 from our work and from the painful toil of our hands." 30Lamech lived after he fathered Noah 595 years and had other sons and daughters. 31 Thus all the days of Lamech were 777 years, and he died.
