- 14 ¶ And God said, Let there be ^m lights in the firmament of the heaven to divide the day from the night; and let them be for signs, and ⁿ for seasons, and for days, and years:
- 15 And let them be for lights in the firmament of the heaven to give light upon the earth: and it was so.
- 16 And God °made two great lights; the greater light to rule the day, and °the lesser light to rule the night: he made °the stars also.

4 ¶ These are the generations of the heavens and of the earth when they were created, in the day that the LORD God made the earth and the heavens, 5 And every hplant of the field before it was in the earth, and every herb of the field before it grew: for the LORD God had not 'caused it to rain upon the earth, and there was not a man'to till the ground.

6 But there went up a mist from the earth, and watered the whole face of the ground.

7 And the LORD God formed man of the dust of the ground, and breathed into his mostrils the breath of life; and man became a living soul.

THE GARDEN OF EDEN

8 ¶ And the LORD God planted °a garden °eastward in °Eden; and there 'he put the man whom he had formed.

And out of the ground made the LORD God to grow 'every tree that is pleasant to the sight, and good for food; 'the tree of life also in the midst of the garden, "and the tree of knowledge of good and evil.

10 And a river went out of Eden to water the garden; and from thence it was parted, and became into four heads.

The name of the first is Pison: that is it which compasseth 'the whole land of Havilah, where there is gold;

12 And the gold of that land is good: wthere is bdellium and the onyx stone.
13 And the name of the second river is Gihon: the same is it that compasseth the whole land of Ethiopia.

14 And the name of the third river is *Hiddekel: that is it which goeth toward the east of Assyria. And the fourth river is Euphrates.

MAN TO CARE FOR THE GARDEN

15 And the LORD God took the man, and put him into the garden of Eden to dress it and to keep it.

16 And the LORD God commanded the man, saying, Of every tree of the garden thou mayest freely eat:

17 ²But of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, ^athou shalt not eat of it: for in the day that thou eatest thereof ^bthou shalt surely die.

18 ¶ And the LORD God said, It is not good that the man should be alone; 'I will make him an help meet for him.

ADAM NAMES LIVING CREATURES

19 dAnd out of the ground the LORD God formed every beast of the field, and every fowl of the air; and brought them unto Adam to see what he would call them: and whatsoever Adam called every living creature, that was the name thereof.

20 And Adam gave names to all cattle, and to the fowl of the air, and to every beast of the field; but for Adam there was not found an help meet for him.

- 7 He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet 'he opened not his mouth: 'he is brought as a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before her shearers is dumb, so he openeth not his mouth. 8 He was taken from prison and from judgment: and who shall declare his generation? for 'he was cut off out of the land of the living: for the transgression of my people was he stricken. 9 "And he made his grave with the wicked, and with the rich in his death; because he had done no violence, neither was any 'deceit in his mouth.

AN OFFERING FOR SIN

10 ¶ Yet it pleased the LORD to bruise him; he hath put him to grief: when thou shalt make his soul "an offering for sin, he shall see his seed, "he shall prolong his days, and "the pleasure of the LORD shall prosper in his hand.

- ²¹ ^mAnd the brother shall deliver up the brother to death, and the father the child: and the children shall rise up against their parents, and cause them to be put to death.
- 22 And "ve shall be hated of all men for my name's sake: "but he that endureth to the end shall be saved.
- 23 But pwhen they persecute you in this city, flee ve into another: for verily I say unto you. Ye shall not have gone over the cities of Israel, atill the Son of man be come.
- 24 'The disciple is not above his master, nor the servant above his lord.
- 25 It is enough for the disciple that he be as his master, and the servant as his lord. If 'they have called the master of the house Beelzebub, how much more shall they call them of his household?
- 26 Fear them not therefore: for there is nothing covered, that shall not be revealed; and hid, that shall not be known.

- 28 "And fear not them which kill the body, but are not able to kill the soul: but rather fear him which is able to destroy both soul and body in hell.
- 29 Are not two sparrows sold for a farthing? and one of them shall not fall on the ground without your Father. 30 'But the very hairs of your head are

all numbered.

- 31 Fear ve not therefore, ve are of more value than many sparrows.
- 32 Whosoever therefore shall confess me before men. *him will I confess also before my Father which is in heaven.
- 33 But whosoever shall deny me before men, him will I also deny before my Father which is in heaven.
- 34 Think not that I am come to send peace on earth: I came not to send peace, but a sword.
- 35 For I am come to set a man at variance against his father, and the daughter against her mother, and the daughter in law against her mother in law.
- 36 And a man's foes shall be they of his own household.
- 37 'He that loveth father or mother more than me is not worthy of me: and he that loveth son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me.
- 38 dAnd he that taketh not his cross. and followeth after me, is not worthy of me.
- 39 'He that findeth his life shall lose it: and he that loseth his life for my sake shall find it.
- 40 ¶^fHe that receiveth you receiveth me, and he that receiveth me receiveth him that sent me.

41 gHe that receiveth a prophet in the name of a prophet shall receive a prophet's reward; and he that receiveth a righteous man in the name of a righteous man shall receive a righteous man's reward.

42 And whosoever shall give to drink unto one of these little ones a cup of cold water only in the name of a disciple, verily I say unto you, he shall in no wise lose his reward.

- 9 For I was alive without the law once: but when the commandment came, sin revived, and I died.
- 10 And the commandment, fwhich was ordained to life, I found to be unto death.
- II For sin, taking occasion by the commandment, deceived me, and by it slew *me*.
- ¹² Wherefore ⁹the law *is* holy, and the commandment holy, and just, and good.
- ¹³ Was then that which is good made death unto me? God forbid. But sin, that it might appear sin, working death in me by that which is good; that sin by the commandment might become exceeding sinful.
- 14 For we know that the law is spiritual: but I am carnal, "sold under sin. 15 For that which I do I allow not: for what I would, that do I not; but what I hate, that do I.
- 16 If then I do that which I would not, I consent unto the law that it is good.
 17 Now then it is no more I that do it, but sin that dwelleth in me.
- 18 For I know that ^Jin me (that is, in my flesh,) dwelleth no good thing: for to will is present with me; but *how* to perform that which is good I find not.
 19 For the good that I would I do not: but the evil which I would not, that I do.
- 20 Now if I do that I would not, it is no more I that do it, but sin that dwelleth in me.
- ²¹ I find then a law, that, when I would do good, evil is present with me.
- ²² For I ^k delight in the law of God after ^lthe inward man:
- 23 But "I see another law in "my members, warring against the law of my mind, and bringing me into captivity to the law of sin which is in my members.

- 24 O wretched man that I am! who shall deliver me from the body of this death?
- 25°I thank God through Jesus Christ our Lord. So then with the mind I myself serve the law of God; but with the flesh the law of sin.

CHAPTER 8 THE SPIRIT OF LIFE



here is therefore now no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus, ^pwho walk not after the flesh, but after

the Spirit.

- ² For ⁹the law of 'the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus hath made me free from 'the law of sin and death.
- The law of sin and death.

 For 'what the law could not do, in that it was weak through the flesh,
- "God sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh, and for sin, condemned sin in the flesh:
- 4 That the righteousness of the law might be fulfilled in us, 'who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit.
- 5 For "they that are after the flesh do mind the things of the flesh; but they that are after the Spirit *the things of the Spirit.
- ⁶ For 'to be carnally minded is death; but to be spiritually minded is life and peace.
- 7 Because 'the carnal mind is enmity against God: for it is not subject to the law of God, 'neither indeed can be.
- 8 So then they that are in the flesh cannot please God.
- 9 But ye are not in the flesh, but in the Spirit, if so be that bthe Spirit of God dwell in you. Now if any man have not 'the Spirit of Christ, he is none of his.

10 And if Christ be in you, the body is dead because of sin; but the Spirit is life because of righteousness.

II But if the Spirit of him that raised up Jesus from the dead dwell in you, he that raised up Christ from the dead shall also quicken your mortal bodies by his Spirit that dwelleth in you.

LED BY THE SPIRIT

- 12 ^fTherefore, brethren, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live after the flesh.
- 13 For ⁹ if ye live after the flesh, ye shall die: but if ye through the Spirit do ^hmortify the deeds of the body, ye shall live
- 14 For 'as many as are led by the Spirit of God, they are the sons of God.
- ¹⁵ For ¹ye have not received the spirit of bondage again ^kto fear; but ye have received the ¹Spirit of adoption, whereby we cry, ^mAbba, Father.
- 16 The Spirit itself beareth witness with our spirit, that we are the children of God:
- ¹⁷ And if children, then heirs; °heirs of God, and joint-heirs with Christ; °if so be that we suffer with *him*, that we may be also glorified together.

ANTICIPATION OF GLORY

- 18 For I reckon that ⁹the sufferings of this present time *are* not worthy *to be compared* with the glory which shall be revealed in us.
- 19 For 'the earnest expectation of the creature waiteth for the 'manifestation of the sons of God.
- 20 For the creature was made subject to vanity, not willingly, but by reason of him who hath subjected the same in hope,

- ²¹ Because the creature itself also shall be delivered from the bondage of corruption into the glorious liberty of the children of God.
- 22 For we know that the whole creation "groaneth and travaileth in pain together until now.
- ²³ And not only *they*, but ourselves also, which have 'the firstfruits of the Spirit, "even we ourselves groan within ourselves, 'waiting for the adoption, *to wit.* the 'redemption of our body.
- ²⁴ For we are saved by hope: but 'hope that is seen is not hope: for what a man seeth, why doth he yet hope for?
 ²⁵ But if we hope for that we see not, then do we with patience wait for it.
- 26 Likewise the Spirit also helpeth our infirmities: for "we know not what we should pray for as we ought: but "the Spirit itself maketh intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered.
- ²⁷ And ^che that searcheth the hearts knoweth what *is* the mind of the Spirit, because he maketh intercession for the saints ^daccording to *the will of* God.

MORE THAN CONQUERORS

- 28 And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them 'who are the called according to his purpose.
- ²⁹ For whom ¹he did foreknow, ⁹he also did predestinate ^hto be conformed to the image of his Son, ¹that he might be the firstborn among many brethren.

 ³⁰ Moreover whom he did predestinate them he also salled; and whom
- nate, them he also 'called: and whom he called, them he also 'justified: and whom he justified, them he also 'glorified.

- 7 And when the thousand years are expired, "Satan shall be loosed out of his prison,
- ⁸ And shall go out "to deceive the nations which are in the four quarters of the earth, 'Gog and Magog,' to gather them together to battle: the number of whom is as the sand of the sea.
- 9 'And they went up on the breadth of the earth, and compassed the camp of the saints about, and the beloved city: and fire came down from God out of heaven, and devoured them.
- ¹⁰ And the devil that deceived them was cast into the lake of fire and brimstone, ^bwhere the beast and the false prophet *are*, and ^cshall be tormented day and night for ever and ever.

THE BOOK OF LIFE

- II And I saw a great white throne, and him that sat on it, from whose face the earth and the heaven fled away; and there was found no place for them.
- 12 And I saw the dead, fsmall and great, stand before God; gand the books were opened: and another book was opened, which is the book of life: and the dead were judged out of those things which were written in the books. Jaccording to their works.
- ¹³ And the sea gave up the dead which were in it; and ¹death and hell delivered up the dead which were in them: ^kand they were judged every man according to their works.
- 14 And 'death and hell were cast into the lake of fire. This is the second death.

- 3 And I heard a great voice out of heaven saying, Behold, 'the tabernacle of God is with men, and he will dwell with them, and they shall be his people, and God himself shall be with them, and be their God.
- 4 'And God shall wipe away all tears from their eyes; "and there shall be no

THE FOUNTAIN OF LIFE

- 6 And he said unto me, 'It is done. 'I am Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the end. 'I will give unto him that is athirst of the fountain of the water of life freely.
- 7 He that overcometh shall inherit all things; and 'I will be his God, and he shall be my son.
- 8 d But the fearful, and unbelieving, and the abominable, and murderers, and whoremongers, and sorcerers, and idolaters, and all liars, shall have their part in the lake which burneth with fire and brimstone: which is the second death.
- 9 And there came unto me one of ^f the seven angels which had the seven vials full of the seven last plagues, and talked with me, saying, Come hither, I will shew thee ^g the bride, the Lamb's wife.
- •• And he carried me away hin the spirit to a great and high mountain, and shewed me that great city, the holy Jerusalem, descending out of heaven from God,
- II Having the glory of God: and her light was like unto a stone most precious, even like a jasper stone, clear as crystal;
- 12 And had a wall great and high, and had *twelve gates, and at the gates twelve angels, and names written thereon, which are the names of the twelve tribes of the children of Israel:

13 'On the east three gates; on the north three gates; on the south three gates; and on the west three gates.

14 And the wall of the city had twelve foundations, and min them the names of the twelve apostles of the Lamb.

THE GOLDEN REED

- 15 And he that talked with me "had a golden reed to measure the city, and the gates thereof, and the wall thereof.
- 16 And the city lieth foursquare, and the length is as large as the breadth: and he measured the city with the reed, twelve thousand furlongs. The length and the breadth and the height of it are equal.
- 17 And he measured the wall thereof, an hundred *and* forty *and* four cubits, *according to* the measure of a man, that is, of the angel.
- 18 And the building of the wall of it was *of* jasper: and the city *was* pure gold, like unto clear glass.
- 19 'And the foundations of the wall of the city were garnished with all manner of precious stones. The first foundation was jasper; the second, sapphire; the third, a chalcedony; the fourth, an emerald;
- 20 The fifth, sardonyx; the sixth, sardius; the seventh, chrysolite; the eighth, beryl; the ninth, a topaz; the tenth, a chrysoprasus; the eleventh, a jacinth; the twelfth, an amethyst.
- ²¹ And the twelve gates *were* twelve pearls; every several gate was of one pearl: ^p and the street of the city *was* pure gold, as it were transparent glass.

22 And I saw no temple therein: for the Lord God Almighty and the Lamb are the temple of it.

- 5 And there shall be no night there; and they need no candle, neither light of the sun; for the Lord God giveth them light: and they shall reign for ever and ever.

⁶ And he said unto me, ¹These sayings are faithful and true: and the Lord God of the holy prophets ^ksent his angel to shew unto his servants the things which must shortly be done.

- 7 'Behold, I come quickly: "blessed is he that keepeth the sayings of the prophecy of this book.
- 8 And I John saw these things, and heard them. And when I had heard and seen, "I fell down to worship before the feet of the angel which shewed me these things.
- 9 Then saith he unto me, "See thou do it not: for I am thy fellowservant, and of thy brethren the prophets, and of them which keep the sayings of this book: worship God.
